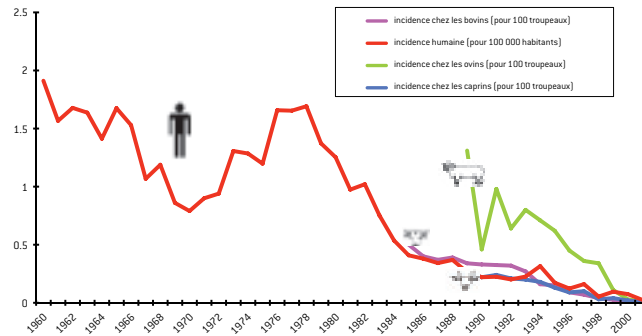


Evolution of zoonosis in Europe. Example of the incidence of brucellosis in humans and ruminants, France 1960 – 2003:
