Description of the department and profile of competence:	SUD Bali Mandara or Bali Mandara Hospital is one of reference hospital In Bali Province. As a type B Hospital in accordance with Ministry of Health of Indonesia's Classification, Bali Mandara Hospital is very concern to Antimicrobial Resistance and Infection Prevention Control Issues. This hospital started to implement Antimicrobial Stewardship Program since 2018, a year after the hospital has just begun. After 4 years of the AMS program, the implementation of ASP starts to run from zero in Bali Mandara Hospital.
Description of your AMS programme:	The AMS program in Bali Mandara Hospital started since 2018. As a new hospital in Bali, this hospital has 210 beds and has potential support from local Government. At the beginning of AMS Program being developed, it consist of multidisciplinary element like Clinical Microbiologist (as a leader), Intensivist, Pharmacist, Nurse and other related specialists. We started our Antimicrobial Stewardship round since January 2019, we assess the antimicrobial usage in some kinds of wards like intensive care unit and non intensive wards. We restrict the use of some antimicrobials like Meropenem, Cefepime, Vancomycin and other kinds of reserve antimicrobial based on WHO classification through the system that we call "Penatagunaan Antimikroba / PGA" (Indonesian version of Antimicrobial Stewardship Program). The lack of IT system somehow make the implementation of this program become more difficult especially to restrict the use of Prophylactic antibiotic. We need to develop better system of AMS Program in my hospital by enhancing our team capabilities to conduct the use of prudent use of antibiotics.
What can the trainee expect:	A better system and experience from developed countries who have already been conduct this program very well.
