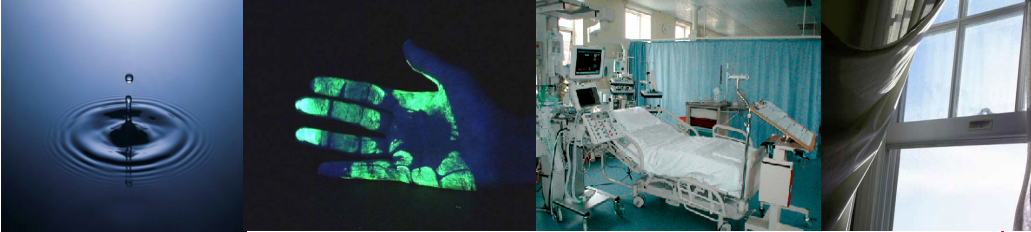

- ESGNI is the ESCMID study group (SG) on nosocomial infections and is one of the oldest SGs in ESCMID
- Since ESGNI began many other SGs evolved of which some cover infection prevention & control
- In 2016, this prompted ESGNI to redefine its aims and goals ESGNI now has a focus on topics not found among other SGs;
 - cleaning & disinfection of the physical environment;
 - design of healthcare facilities including air, ventilation and water;
 - isolation techniques, (re)defining the 5 moments of HH,
 - action planning/ergonomics and behavioural studies
- ESGNI collaborates with other SGs on topics related to nosocomial infections to perform European-wide studies
- ESGNI works with the European Committee on Infection Control (EUCIC) to share network and resources
- ESGNI is represented in EUCIC, EUNETIPS and ECDC projects
